

Information for persons entering or returning to Schleswig-Holstein from travel abroad

What must travellers consider?

If you wish to enter the Federal Republic of Germany **by air travel** coming from a foreign country (that is from any foreign country, not only from high-risk areas in foreign countries), you are obligated to present to the airline prior to departure a negative SARS-CoV-2 test in either print or electronic form in either German, English or French. You must have the test result with you upon arrival and you must present it on demand in case of a border check. The test on which the result document is based must comply with the requirements of the Robert Koch Institute, which are published online at https://www.rki.de/covid-19-tests. You must pay for the test yourself. The airline may offer testing accordingly. You are not allowed to travel without a negative SARS-CoV-2 test. You are also not allowed to travel if the test result is positive. You are then personally responsible for compliance with local requirements regarding isolation. This does not change any other applicable testing requirements, which will still apply. You will then receive further information regarding these matters.

It is important to check before entering the state whether you are coming from a currently designated high-risk area, high-incidence area or virus variant area at the time of entry. These areas in foreign countries are listed on the website of the Robert Koch Institute

Important, please read: Persons entering Schleswig-Holstein or returning to the state from high-risk areas in other countries to whom none of the exceptions apply are obligated to comply with the following regulations:

Registration procedure

Before crossing the border to enter this state you must register on the internet at

www.einreiseanmeldung.de. You are required to provide your contact data, details of your travels and health status. You then receive confirmation of registration, which you must have with you when you cross the border. When arriving here from the Schengen Area you must give your confirmation to the party providing your transport (if relevant) and when arriving from outside of the Schengen Area you must present the confirmation to the competent authority when you cross the border. If the digital entry registration procedure malfunctions, or you are unable to use it, a **substitute entry registration form** can be filled out using the form that can be downloaded here

https://www.bundesgesundheitsministerium.de/fileadmin/Dateien/3 Downloads/C/Coronavirus/Infoblatt/Anlag e 2 Ersatzmitteilung.pdf. The completed form must then also be presented on demand upon entry.

Obligatory testing

You must undergo a SARS-CoV-2 virus test to enter the state from a foreign high-risk area, high-incidence area or virus variant area. This obligation does not apply to children under six years of age. If you are arriving from a high-risk area or were in a high-risk area that is **not** a high-incidence area or virus variant area at any time in the past ten days before entering the state, you must present a negative SARS-

CoV-2 test **at the latest 48 hours after entering the state**. You may also have yourself tested after entering the state and you may leave your guarantine location for this purpose.

If you enter the state from a high-risk area or were at any time in the past ten days before entering the state in a high-risk area that is **a high-incidence area or virus variant area**, you must be in possession of a negative SARS-CoV-2 test when you cross the border to enter the state. The smear sample for the test must not have been taken more than 48 hours before you cross the border to enter the state. You must have the test result with you when you cross the border.

The test result must be in the form of either a print or electronic document in German, English or French and must be presented to the competent Public Health Office (*Gesundheitsamt*) on demand without delay within



ten days of your entry. The test on which the result document is based must comply with the requirements of the Robert Koch Institute, which are published online at https://www.rki.de/covid-19-tests.

Quarantine

After crossing the border to enter the state you must ...

proceed directly to your home or to another suitable accommodation, remain under quarantine for 14 days at home or in the appropriate accommodation. During this period, you must not receive any visitors who are not members of your household. inform the local Public Health Office without delay if symptoms indicating an infection with the SARS-CoV-2 virus occur during the quarantine period.

Possible shortening of quarantine period

The quarantine period can only be shortened if you are arriving from a foreign high-risk area or high-incidence area and <u>not</u> from a virus variant area (in which latter case you must remain under quarantine for 14 days). You must also not have been in a virus variant area during the ten days prior to arrival.

To shorten the ten-day quarantine period under these conditions you must have a negative test result. The test must not have been conducted earlier than five days after your arrival in Germany. In this case you may leave quarantine isolation. Thus you must remain under quarantine for at least 5 days and may not leave quarantine isolation until you have a negative test result.

The compulsory test before or shortly after arrival is not relevant regarding shortening of the quarantine period. An additional test must be performed to shorten the quarantine period.

You may have this test done by your family doctor or at a testing centre.

The test result document must be in print or electronic form in German, English, Danish or French. Either a rapid antigen test or a PCR test can be done.

You must keep the test result in your possession for at least ten days after arrival and present it to the local Public Health Office on demand.

Important: Quarantine isolation is compulsory until you receive the test result. Even after leaving quarantine isolation and for a period of ten days after arrival, you must also have testing done for SARS-CoV-2 if you experience symptoms of infection with the virus. Persons returning from travel abroad **do not** automatically have the right to be tested. Tests that are medically necessary or ordered by the Public Health Office will be processed on a priority basis.

Fines

Persons violating these regulations are subject to fines and can be checked on by the authorities for this purpose.

- Violation of quarantine: 500 to 10,000 euros
- Failure to proceed directly to your home or to another suitable accommodation: 150 to 3,000 euros
- Receiving visitors in violation of the guarantine: 300 to 5,000 euros
- If symptoms occur subsequently during the quarantine period and you fail to inform, or to inform without delay, the local Public Health Office: 150 to 2000 euros.
- You may also be fined if you fail to register prior to entering the state using the online entry
 portal, have not completed a substitute registration in print form or fail to comply with
 obligatory testing.



Exceptions (examples only, not exhaustive)

The exceptions only apply to you if you do not enter the state from a virus variant area and are not suffering from any symptoms that indicate an infection with SARS-CoV-2 (loss of sense of smell or taste, fever, cough, cold symptoms (rhinitis)). You are obligated to contact the local Public Health Office if you experience symptoms of a SARS-CoV-2 infection (exception: travellers in transit).

- 1) Conditions under which the obligatory quarantine and registration, as well as the requirement to present a negative SARS-CoV-2 test upon arrival, do not apply to you:
 - ... if you are passing through Schleswig-Holstein in transit only; in this case you must leave the state by a direct route.
 - ...if you arrive from Denmark within the framework of "short-stay cross-border traffic" and have been in a foreign high-risk area for less than 24 hours or wish to travel to Germany for less than 24 hours (whereby testing would become compulsory if Denmark is declared to be a high-incidence area)
 - ... if you are staying in Schleswig-Holstein for less than 72 hours to visit first-degree relatives, spouse or life partner not from the same household or persons for whom you have shared custody or right of contact, (whereby these contact persons must register as such). For stays longer than 72 hours you must present a negative SARS-CoV-2 test no longer than 48 hours after entry see item 2) for requirements.
